The EPA recently released the final version of the Good Neighbor Rule which requires a large portion of the reciprocating compression fleet in the United States above 1,000 hp to operate at no more than 3g NOx emissions by mid-2026.



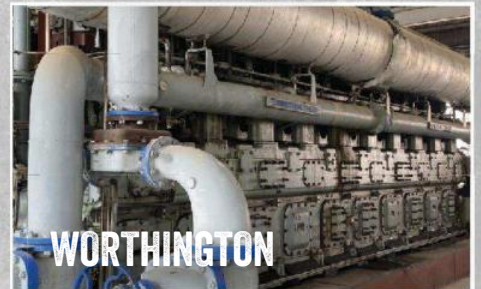
